I have over 20 years of library experience and I have been working as Library Director at Koç University in Istanbul, Turkey since 2011. I had Assistant Director and Systems Librarian positions at Koç University since I joined in 1998. Koç University Library system that I am responsible for as the Director consists of the Main Library, the Health Sciences Library and 3 research libraries. Our Health Sciences Library is situated in our Medical Campus to serve the School of Medicine and the School of Nursing along with the medical personnel of our teaching and research hospital.

I earned my BS from Boğaziçi University Molecular Biology and Genetics and my MLS from Indiana University.

My road crossed with EAHIL in 2010. My first EAHIL Conference was Estoril, Portugal.
