<i>My professional education and experience</i>	<p>My current position is Senior Research Fellow, Information Science, with three teams at the UEMS which I've been doing for over 10 years. I essentially develop and run searches for various types of evidence syntheses, mainly systematic reviews but also systematic maps, rapid reviews and scoping reviews. I also teach internally and externally.
